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

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


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FAMILY OF CRASH VICTIM SPEAK OUT AS DRINK-DRIVE FRIEND JAILED

POLITICS IN THE UNIVERSITY.

STUDENT SENT DOWN OVER COMMUNIST PAPER.

How far ought undergraduates to be encouraged or permitted to imbibe extreme views in politics, and expound and illustrate them at a University in a propagandist newspaper? This is a question to which attention has recently been drawn by the case of a young undergraduate, Mr. Arthur Reade, who has been banished from the University on the ground of his extreme opinions in politics. Mr. Reade edited a paper which he called "Free Oxford, a Communist Journal of Youth," and was assisted in his journalistic task by Mr. Charles Gray. Both have fallen under the censure of the University authorities, Mr. Reade being "sent down" by formal act of the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors, while Mr. Gray is rusticated for a couple of terms.

As to the opinions expressed in "Free Oxford," we understand that they were of the most revolutionary type, the journal advocating a sort of class war and the suppression of the bourgeoisie in the spirit of Lenin and Trotsky. According to these precocious revolutionaries - for Mr. Reade is not yet 20 years of age and his associate editor is younger still - the future is to be painted in dark colours - dark, that is to say, to all except those who have enrolled themselves under an anarchical standard. The Capitalistic system, we are assured, will break down, and then the workers will have their chance. The Capitalists may use force to resist, and then the workers will have in their turn to employ violent means to destroy the existing members of the Capitalist class.

Such is the cheerful programme of Messrs. Reade and Gray, evidently based on what they have read about the autocracy of the proletariat. It seems a somewhat foolish escapade for young men only at the beginning of their career thus to bring down upon themselves the severe and stern condemnation of those responsible for the welfare of the University and its scholars, Perhaps, however, it is not merely foolish, but is also dangerous. Youth is the time for violent opinions, and the contagion of extreme and anarchical belief runs quickly through an easily-excited community. The spirit of toleration and compromise is only born in a later period, when years have brought the philosophic mind.

Clearly, however, this is no case of interference with the rights of free speech, for the simple reason that we are dealing with a peculiar set of circumstances at a University, where young men are still supposed to be "in statu pupillari," that is to say, not altogether capable of self-government and self-direction. That they should read much and think a good deal about the prevalent state of society is only to be expected from keen young men who think that they may possibly be called to play a part in future history.

REVOLUTIONARY PRINCIPLES

In circumstances like these, modesty, to say nothing else, ought to suggest a certain reticence in publishing views of a subversive character and attempting by means of a newspaper to bring revolutionary principles into the minds of other young men equally in earnest about politics. Let them think out social problems by all means, let them attempt to form a definite judgment wherever such is possible, let them argue for or against revolutionary change. All these things are possible to undergraduates owing to the popularity of their union societies and the valuable lessons in controversy which are open to them on debating nights. But when a young man not yet 20 years of age bids hysterical defiance to social life as it exists, and more especially to University life, then we think it is right for the authorities to intervene and to banish any member of their community who is a red-hot Bolshevik, and who asks his friends to remember that Lenin, too, as well as Shelley, was banished from a University. Anarchy at the age of 19, anarchy that takes its cue from the disastrous experiments of Bolshevism, does not consort with the "enchantments of the Middle Ages."


